"Partnering"

Have you ever said to yourself, "I just can't do this thing alone, I need some help?"



There is certainly truth in the adages...*many hands make the work light and the more the merrier*. Goals are accomplished quicker, easier, and usually with greater results...when people who share a similar passion come together to accomplish a common goal.

The importance of *PARTNERSHIPS* is becoming increasingly valuable at *Gospel Rescue Mission*. As we continue to go "outside our walls" and into our community with help and hope even more so we need to partner with businesses, social service agencies, and most of all the churches and the Christian community.

Here are just a few of the ways we've formed partnerships in the past several years:

- Our *Community Ministries Department* has partnered with several churches, helping the churches reach out to their neighbors with our resources of food and clothing.
- GRM staff members are actively involved in several city-wide coalitions including the *Tucson Planning Council for the Homeless*, the faith based sub-committee of the *Meth Free Alliance*, the *Arizona Coalition to End Homelessness*, the *CPSA Mental Health and Substance Use Disorder* committee, the faith based sub-committee of the *Workforce Investment Board*...naming just a few.
- Churches have partnered with us on various Mission projects such as Adopt-A-Room at our Women's Center (for remodeling and painting), Neighborhood Outreach Projects (fixing up homes of indigent neighbors in South Tucson), Saturday Outreach (weekly Bilingual Chapel service and Kid's Club activities and Good Shepherd), etc.
- Individuals are partnering with us as chapel speakers, counselors, mentors, case managers, teachers, discipleship instructors, and maintenance technicians.
- The professional community is partnering with us to provide much needed services such as free dental and legal assistance and businesses are helping through donations of goods, services, and financial support.

Bottom line is that ALL parties get BLESSED when we partner together. On page 4 is an excerpt from a letter we received from an advocate at a women's sexual assault agency that expresses how well partnerships work.

Men's Center

Jim Young, a volunteer partner instructor at the Men's Center, is a Hall of Fame football coach with a passion for coaching men into their full potential. He conducts an 8-session course, three to four times a year, on setting goals and priorities called Carpe Diem "Seize The Day!"



Jim was born and raised in Van Wert, Ohio. He and his wife of 48 years, Jane, have five children, eight grandchildren and one great-grandchild.

A look at his record will tell a great story. Jim played football under the legendary Woody Hayes at Ohio, and got a Master's Degree at Bowling Green. He gained coaching experience under Bo Schembechler at Miami University (Ohio) and at the University of Michigan. He was Acting Head Coach when Michigan won the 1970 Rose Bowl.

Jim was head coach at Arizona 1973-76 (W-33 L-13); Purdue University 1976-81 (W-38 L-19); West Point, 1983-90 (W-51 L-39); Offensive Line Coach under Dick Tomey at Arizona 1992-94; Retired in 1995. Totals as a player and a coach: W-352, L-125, T-12, Twenty Championships, Eight undefeated seasons, Eighteen bowl games. Halls of Fame: College Football Hall of Fame 1999; Lima Shawnee 1988; Bowling Green State University 1989; University of Arizona 1996; Purdue University 2004.

Jim is very humble and does not brag about his accomplishments. Yet, with his record dripping with the experience of success, Jim knows how to connect with the hearts and minds of men, and how to motivate them to set worthy goals. Jim is constantly setting goals for himself. He obtained a Masters in Military Studies, Land Warfare in 2004. He conducts leadership-motivational seminars for football teams and coaching staffs, is writing books, and serves the Christian community through the Stephen Ministries.

His Christian experience provides great insight into the mindset of men who face great challenges. Since he is an astute observer of people and their beliefs, he is eminently qualified to make a case for setting good goals in one's search for recovery and integrity. Students of his Carpe Diem classes are better prepared for the discipling classes of the Life Foundations Restoration Program operated by the Men's Center. The Men's Center staff deeply appreciates the contribution Jim is making to the fifty Restoration students in their search for a wise, moral, responsible and lawful lifestyle.

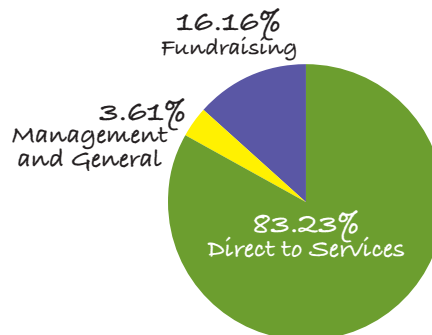
There is no exercise better for the heart than reaching out and lifting people up.

Ministry Partner

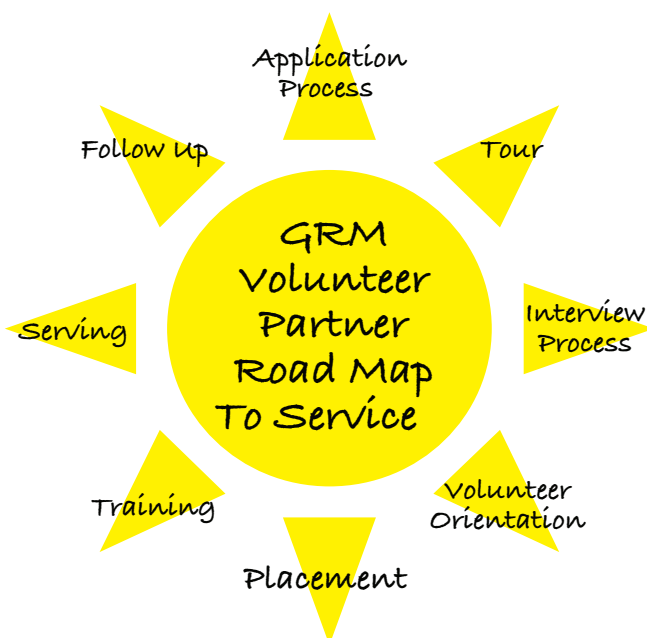

Southern Arizona Center Against Sexual Assault's Su Voz Vale is a bilingual/bicultural program. The mission statement of the center is to reduce the incidence and impact of sexual violence in our community. Delia Gastelum is a crisis advocate and educator at Su Voz Vale.

Application Process

Contact is made by potential volunteer partner in person, phone, web or mail. A volunteer partner application packet is given to potential volunteer partner to complete and return to T.E.A.M. Volunteer Coordinator. All potential volunteer partners are required to complete a tour, application and interview to become a volunteer partner.

Tour

Potential volunteer partners will tour the Mission and a volunteer partner packet is given to potential volunteer partner. Potential volunteer partners will be asked to pray about serving at the Mission. The potential volunteer partner will need to return volunteer partner packet to T.E.A.M. Volunteer office.

Interview Process

Each volunteer partner is interviewed by T.E.A.M. Volunteer Department after references are checked and volunteer partner packet is complete. Volunteer partner opportunities will be shared with potential volunteer partner.

Volunteer Orientation

Each quarter a volunteer partner orientation is held to help volunteer partners make an easy transition to volunteering. Job descriptions will be available so potential volunteer partners can pray about a place to serve.

Placement

Volunteer partners will be given a job description of position where placed. The volunteer partner is introduced to staff supervisor. Volunteer partner is placed into a position after much prayer.

Training

Staff supervisor and Staff will train volunteer partners to perform the job that has been assigned. Staff will monitor each volunteer partner and adjust schedule and duties to help volunteer partner be successful.

Serving

Volunteer partners will be scheduled to serve at the convenience of the volunteer partner. Volunteer Partners will sign in at location of service. If problems arise the volunteer partner is encouraged to share with staff or staff supervisor. Staff is encouraged to visit with T.E.A.M. Volunteer Coordinator to help solve the problem. If the problem is not resolved then the volunteer partner is encouraged to talk with the T.E.A.M. Volunteer Coordinator.

Follow-Up

The Volunteer partner will be contacted weekly or after serving four weeks of service to see how things are going. Staff supervisor will be contacted weekly for the first four weeks of service to see how things are going. Staff supervisor and T.E.A.M. Volunteer Coordinator will monitor the situation. Quarterly follow-up contact will be made with volunteer partner and staff supervisor.

Christian Partnership

Did you know that all Christians are called to “partnership”? Ok, maybe a better word to describe partnership for a Christian would be discipleship.

In John 8:31, Jesus said to the people who believed in him, “*You are my disciples if you keep obeying my teachings.*” In John 13:34-35, Jesus gave a new commandment to all his disciples, “*So now I am giving you a new commandment: Love each other. Just as I have loved you, you should love each other. Your love for one another will prove to the world that you are my disciples.*”

Whenever Jesus calls his disciples to “love”, he is calling them to action! We at Gospel Rescue Mission believe that we are called to display His love in some very specific areas of action. In Matthew 25:35-36, Jesus spoke to us about the final judgment and how He would measure the heart of His believers.

“For I was hungry and you fed me.”

(Gospel Rescue Mission served over 116,000 meals at our Men’s Center in 2005)

“I was thirsty, and you gave me a drink.”

(Over 28,000 Women and children were served food and drink at our Women and Children’s Center)

“I was a stranger and you invited me into your home.”

(Over 53,500 Men, Women, and Children were Gospel Rescue Mission overnight guests in 2005)

“I was naked and you gave me clothing.”

(Over 645,000 items of clothing were distributed through our joint ministries in 2005)

“I was sick, and you cared for me.”

(Over \$40,000.00 of dental, optical, and medical care was given free of charge to our guests in 2005.)

“I was in prison and you visited me.”

(Gospel Rescue Mission works with volunteers and officials from state and federal corrections facilities to offer hope and personal skills training to men and women coming out of incarceration and wanting to start a new Christ led life.)

So, May I ask you three direct questions?

One:

What stage of discipleship are you in, preparation, revelation, conviction, the call, or deciding whether or not to respond?

Two:

Are you ready to start receiving the blessings of demonstrating Christ’s love to the rest of the world?

Three:

Are you ready to “Partner” with Gospel Rescue Mission?

God may be working in your life to take you to a deeper place in Him. God wants all of us to learn of Him, to have a revelation of His holiness and love.

Pray for God to begin moving you to a deeper walk through an increasing desire to be a disciple of His love. He loves to hear that kind of a prayer from your heart. If you are willing and teachable, it won’t be long before you hear Him say, “Come, follow me!” Perhaps He is speaking to you right now about **Partnering** with us at Gospel Rescue Mission. What will your response be?
